Front entrance

The entrance structure is constructed of a freestanding steel frame incorporating a high level patent glazed canopy with intermediate uprighters. Below this, a glazed porch area is constructed, fixed to the existing building with a zinc mono-pitch roof. The existing reception windows have been removed and the openings adapted to allow access from the entrance to the reception. A new timber service enclosure and entrance matting has been provided internally.

Side Louvres

A self-supporting galvanised steel structure has been constructed to the LHS of the entrance to shade the existing building. The framework is clad in stained cedar and is protected by a ply and zinc mono-pitch roof. The façade incorporates regular voids in the cedar to allow a view from the existing building.

Pergola

The two main structures are joined together and surrounded by a single storey pergola constructed from stained softwood and joined with galvanised steel fitch plates.

External

Externally, the existing carpark is developed into a main Vista walkway and retaining wall constructed with blockwork and faced in dry-stone wall and timber panels. The walkway has been constructed with panels of brick paviours and decking, and lined with marble architectural planters. The entranceway has been finished with areas of brick paviours and basalt with top soil borders. Kerb edging has been laid to falls to allow for the construction of the entrance road, and parking bays. An additional stained timber screen / fence has been constructed along the length of the existing boundary wall.
